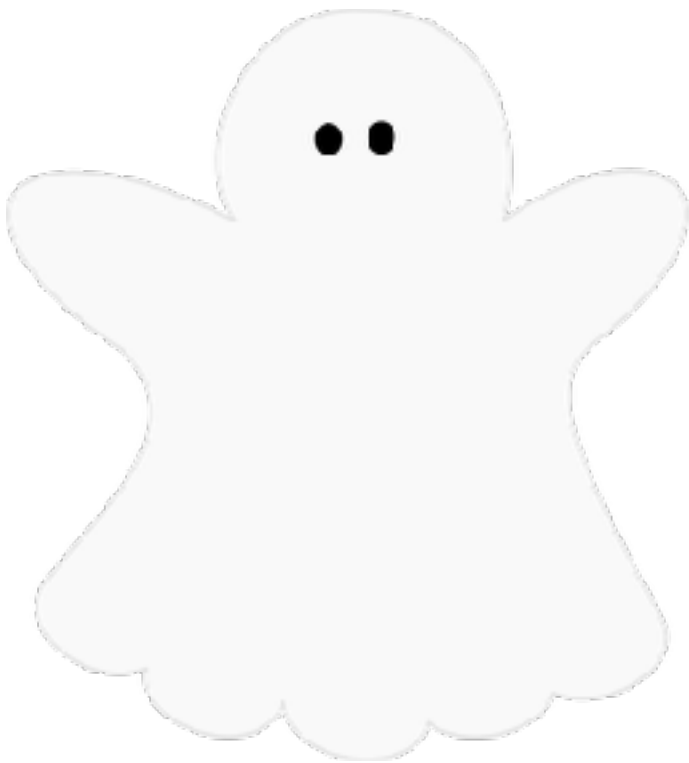

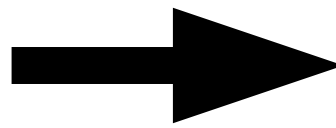

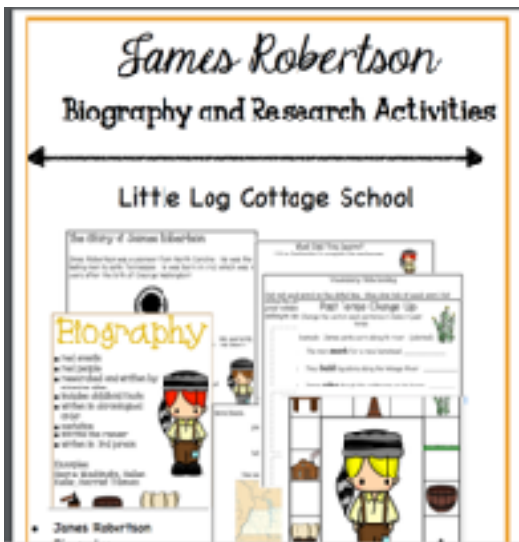

 defined by, coming from, or being direct personal observations or experiences

Second Hand Accounts
 an event or topic is based on an author's research rather than personal experience

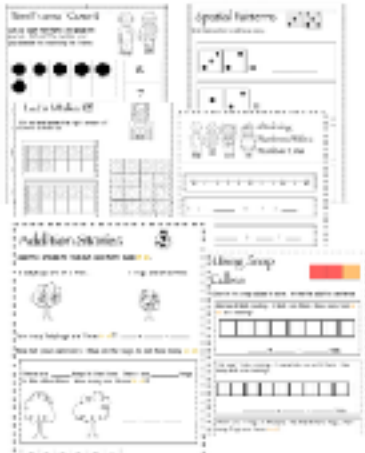
